Missionary teaching positions are available beginning August 2021 at Louverture Cleary School, a tuition-free, Catholic secondary boarding school (grades 7 to 13) in Haiti.

The role of Missionaries at Louverture Cleary School (LCS) is broad and affects many areas of community life:

COMMUNITY LIFE: The presence of the Missionaries gives witness to the philosophy of sacrifice for the sake of others that is so important to the LCS community. Missionaries live at the school in community with Haitian staff, allowing them to spend a significant amount of time with the students both in and out of the classroom.

TEACHING: Primary responsibilities are in the classroom, teaching classes ranging from language and religion to laboratory science and computers.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: Missionaries teach physical education, lead extracurricular activities, and monitor four evening study hours per week. Time spent with students outside the classroom provides LCS students, who live away from their families during the week, sources of stable adult interaction.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT: Each Missionary has personal responsibilities in different areas of the school: language program or other curriculum, work projects, community service programs, etc.

EMPOWERMENT OF STUDENTS: Missionaries lead the students, both in empowerment groups to encourage strength in and outside the classroom, and in daily example.

PROGRAM SUPPORT: Missionaries are asked to assist in raising funds necessary for their support in Haiti. The support raised helps cover the expense of Missionaries' service and raises awareness about the Project and its work in Haiti.
